

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- 1. What is the closing date for entries? Closing date is the day you must have your entry submitted. Closing dates are specified at the beginning of each section.
- 2. Where can I submit my entry form? Entries can be completed on line via www.bendigoshow.com.au/ competitions, by post or at the Bendigo Showgrounds office (Open 9am - 5pm weekdays)
- 3. Where do I deliver my exhibits? To the prescribed pavilion for the relevant section.
- 4. When can I collect my exhibits? Exhibits may only be collected as stated or by arrangement with the Chief Steward of the relevant Section or the Secretary. Hours for collection are detailed in the individual Section Regulations.
- 5. Where & When do I collect my prize money? Prize money in the Homecraft & Floral sections will be paid at the time the exhibits are collected. All other sections will be paid as per the section details.
- **6. Can I bring a dog into the showgrounds?** Dog show entries are permitted for the purpose of the dog show but must be restrained. Assistance dogs are permitted in all areas. No other dogs are permitted on site during the show.
- 7. Do you have wheelchairs/walkers for hire? Items for disabled must be provided as there is no hire available.
- 8. What is the admission fee to the Show? Refer to page 1 of the schedule.
- 9. What time does the Show open and close? Gates 3 will open from 6am and Gate 1 will open from 7am for competitors only. Patrons are permitted via all gates from 9am until 9pm each day.
- 10. Where can I park my car and is there disabled parking available? Parking is available inside the showgrounds or adjacent to the main entrance on Holmes Road. Disabled parking area is adjacent to Gate 1.
- 11. Do I have to pay for car parking? \$10.00 per vehicle inside the grounds after 5pm only or \$5.00 per vehicle in the Society's Holmes Road car park.
- 12. Are there parenting rooms available? Yes located in the foyer of the Exhibition Centre and main toilet block.
- 13. If I bring someone else's entry to the Show who's name should it be under? At all times refer to the exhibitor's name or organisation the exhibit has been entered for the Show.
- 14. How do I know if I should enter novice, intermediate or open, Senior or Junior section?

Novice: A person either exhibiting for the first time or never won a prize or Best Exhibit in that particular section.

Intermediate: An exhibitor that has exhibited previously and been successful wining either the Best Exhibit or a first prize.

Open: An exhibitor that is open age or experience. **Senior**: Exhibitor over the age of 18 years as of the day of the Show.

Junior: Exhibitor 18 years and under as of the day of the

- 15. Can I post my entry or can it be returned by post? Yes provided a pre paid post pack or self addressed envelope/ package is supplied.
- **16. Is there camping available?** *Limited camping is available* for exhibitors or stallholders for a fee of \$25.00 per night.
- **17.** Is there a bus service to the show? Bus stop at the front gate of the show. Buses running every half hour each day.
- 18. Do I have to sign an insurance waiver form? All livestock exhibitors are required to sign a waiver form as a condition of entry.
- 19. Is there an ATM at the show? Yes Bendigo Bank ATM is located outside the Main Entrance.
- **20. What time are the Fireworks?** *9pm each night.*

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

- 1. Entries can be mailed to
 - The Secretary, PO Box 109, Bendigo, Vic., 3552.
- 2. Entries must be submitted via www.bendigoshow.com. au on the proper entry form.
- 3. Correct entry fees must accompany entry forms.
- 4. No Stamps accepted as entry fees
- 5. PLEASE NOTE: GST Inc. in the stated entry fees.
- Please write your entries clearly and supply all the information asked for. When entering animals, please supply all details requested on the entry form.
- Please ensure that your correct postal address is given to receive confirmation of entries and a schedule next year.
- 8. Carefully read the rules and instructions relating to your particular section entry to ensure your entries are entered correctly and in the appropriate classes.
- Prize money in the Hand Crafts & Flowers sections will be paid at the time the exhibits are collected. All other sections will be paid as per the section details.
- Exhibits may only be collected as stated or by arrangement with the Chief Steward of the relevant Section or the Secretary. Hours for collection are detailed in the individual Sections Regulations.

BY LAW REGULATIONS

Governing the Conduct of the Show

- No exhibit will be received without first completing a competition entry form and finalising payment prior to the closing date specified. The Secretary will acknowledge entry and entry fees by returning the exhibitor a receipt of same. Upon production of an exhibitor card the exhibit will be admitted to the grounds. The Secretary shall have the power to extend the date of entry in any section.
- 2. The Committee of the Society reserves the right of refusing or canceling any entry without giving reasons for so doing.
- Exhibit Card(s) will be issued electronically via email on completion of your online entry. In special circumstances they may be sent by post or obtained from the Secretary's Office at the Bendigo Showgrounds, on the day prior to the Show.
- Unless otherwise specified, all exhibits other than arena competitions must, on the day of entry, be the property of the exhibitor.
- 5. The same exhibit cannot enter or compete in two sections except where specially permitted.
- The Committee reserves the right of adjudicating on any questionable entry, or any matter not provided for in the general conditions and regulations of the Society.
- In cases of adverse weather, or any cause whatsoever, the Committee reserves the right to vary or alter or amend any competition, display or arena event, or postpone same to another date should same be considered to be essential.
- Members are entitled to reduced entry fees where stated, providing that the subscription is paid on or before closing dates of entry.
- All entries must be delivered to and removed from the Society's grounds at the cost of the exhibitor.
- Exhibitors or their agents must (if required) point out to the Steward their respective exhibits in order that they may be identified and classified, before being submitted to the judges.
- 11. No exhibit will be admitted into the Society's grounds unless the attendant is in possession of the Secretary's proof of entry, and each exhibit when it enters the grounds, must be delivered to the correct location.
- 12. Exhibitors shall arrange their exhibits under the direction of the Stewards or the Secretary, and no exhibit shall afterwards be moved without the sanction of the Secretary under a penalty not exceeding \$50.00 or the forfeiting of prize money.
- 13. The Committee shall have the power to retain the exhibit until such fine is paid.

- 14. When the judge(s) considers an exhibit in any class to not be of sufficient merit to deserve a prize, no prize will be awarded. Judges may award a second or third prize if they consider the exhibit not worthy of a first prize.
- 15. Should a judge have reason to doubt the age of any animal, he shall refer to the stewards, who shall make inquiries and secure proof of age before the award is made.
- 16. The Committee may withhold any prizes when statements regarding the exhibits are proved to be erroneous, or when an exhibit has not been in accordance with these regulations, and the exhibitor or exhibitors found guilty of false entries or statements shall be liable to be barred from competing again.
- 17. Judges may recommend to the Committee to award a special prize should they consider any exhibit deserving.
- 18. All Perpetual Trophies will be awarded under the following conditions: The winner's name shall be inscribed on the Trophy which is retained by the Society unless special permission is obtained from the Secretary.
- 19. Any prize left unclaimed for longer than 14 days shall be forfeited and cancelled by the Society.
- 20. Should there be any reason to suspect an exhibit is either diseased or dangerous, the Society reserves the right of refusing admittance to or removing the same from the grounds at the expense of the exhibitor.
- 21. All exhibits must remain during the duration of the Show, unless permission is received in writing from the Society.
- 22. All exhibits of machinery must be securely guarded as to be safe to every person. The Society shall not be liable for damages as a result of any accident or contravention of this by-law.
- 23. Any protest against any exhibit or the judge's decision must be made in writing and lodged with the Secretary within 3 hours of judging. The sum of \$50.00 must accompany the protest, and this shall be forfeited and become the property of the Society, if, in the opinion of the Committee, the protest is frivolous.
- 24. Where there is no competition in any class or section, no cash prizes may be awarded unless the judge certifies to special merit.
- 25. Any competitor in arena and horse sections putting their animal(s) in any unauthorised stall will be liable to disqualification by the Stewards.
- 26. Competitors in all Sections (including Arena) will compete at their own responsibility and risk.
- 27. Entry fees paid will not be refunded under any circumstances.
- 28. By completing a competition entry you agree to abide by the terms and conditions as outlined above.



 Should any sample of grain be found to be infected with weevil or any contagious plant disease, it shall be disqualified and removed from the Showgrounds.

CONDITION OF ENTRY

The General Regulations of the Bendigo Agricultural Show Society Inc. appearing in this schedule form part of these AAA approved conditions of entry. In the event of any inconsistency between the General Regulations and these conditions, the General Regulations shall prevail to the extent of the inconsistency unless the General Regulations provide otherwise. This Show will be conducted under the Rules of the Australian Alpaca Association as set out in the current AAA Showing Rules Manual. All exhibitors must behave in accordance with the AAA Exhibitor's Code of Conduct.

PERIOD OF EXHIBITION

Alpacas may be penned on Friday, 27th October before 8pm and must be penned by 8am Saturday, 28th October in readiness for judging at 9am and may not be removed from the Showgrounds until close of Show.

PREPARATION OF EXHIBITS AND CLEANLINESS OF STALLS

Exhibitors must keep the stalls allocated to their animals clean and give proper attention to their stock throughout the show. Exhibitors must provide their own feed and feed and water containers.

ADVERTISING

A4 folders attached to the front of the animal pen is permitted for promotional and sales material otherwise no advertisements or notices (except with the permission of the Chief Steward) are permitted on or in any stalls or buildings. Sale signs are not permitted. Stud names are permitted, but must be contained to the bounds of the pen and to a height of 1500mm. Display or promotional alpacas will not be permitted. Display of Show ribbons awarded at a Show held at another venue is prohibited.

EXHIBITORS MEETING

There will be no exhibitors meeting unless deemed necessary by the Chief Steward. Any program changes will be announced regularly via the PA system.

CAR PARKING

All exhibitors must unload their exhibits in the Pavilion and then park their vehicles in the designated exhibitor car park as quickly as possible. All vehicles must remain in that area until 4pm Saturday.

INSPECTION OF EXHIBITS

- All alpacas must be registered with the Australian Alpaca Association Inc. and carry an approved brass tag showing the alpaca's IAR number.
- No animal shall be eligible for exhibition if it is not entire All genitalia shall be complete, properly formed and proportioned for normal reproduction.
- 3. Inspection of Alpacas will commence at 8am on

Saturday, 28th October or upon arrival if penned on Friday.

- The convener of a Show conducted under Association Rules shall appoint a person, or persons, as an inspector, or inspectors, who shall inspect all alpacas for genetic faults, colour class and IAR number.
- The Inspector or Chief Steward will classify all entries for colour and has the power to transfer an exhibit to the class which, in his or her opinion, it should have entered. The Chief Steward will combine or split classes as he or she sees fit.
- Alpacas not in their allocated pens and available for inspection at the official time may be disqualified by the Chief Steward.
- Exhibitors must be in attendance at the time of inspection.
- Alpacas should be shorn annually. Halter class entry must have a minimum fleece length of 50 millimetres for Huacaya and Suri and a maximum fleece age: For Huacaya of under 14 months; For Suri in a first fleece of under 18 months, and For Suri in a second or subsequent fleece of under 14 months.
- Any alpaca found to have lice infestation must be removed from the Showgrounds immediately along with any other alpacas present that belong to the same exhibitor.
- The only person or stud eligible to exhibit an animal is the owner listed in the AAA register or the agent of the registered owner.

NOTE: If there is no IAR tag present in the ear of an animal exhibit, official Association confirmation must be provided by the owner to the Chief Steward that the ear tag has been recently lost and that a new tag has been ordered.

JUDGING

- Judging will commence promptly at 9am Saturday, 28th October.
- A competitor may not discuss with the Judge their alpacas, or proposed exhibits prior to, or during the show judging.
- The Judge's decision shall be final. He or she may choose not to award a prize or prizes in a class.
- 4. In the show ring the exhibitors' uniform will comply with Rule 50 of the AAA Showing Rules Manual and include the AAA logo on either the AAA black shirt, or the AAA black vest. The vest may be worn over the AAA shirt or a black shirt (with either short or long sleeves). These are worn over black trousers or a long black skirt and clean brown or black closed-in shoes.
- The Chief Steward may disqualify an exhibitor for incorrect attire.
- 6. All exhibitors shall, on the day of the show, obtain their pen positions and class numbers from the Shed Steward. Class number of the exhibit and the age of the alpaca, in months, must be worn and clearly displayed by the handler whilst in the show ring. Arm bands should be worn on the LEFT arm.
- All handlers showing animals must be competent in the handling of their exhibit, or the Judge may request removal from the ring.
- All exhibitors must place their animals in the pens allotted by the show stewards and must not be moved or removed except by order of the Chief Steward.

FLEECES

- All Fleeces being exhibited (including wether fleeces) must be the bona fide property of the AAA Ltd financial Member.
- 2. All Fleece exhibitors must attach the exhibit number (no names) supplied for that class.
- Only one fleece that has been shorn in the 18 months prior to the Show may be shown from any one animal.
- Fleeces are to be lodged with the Fleece Steward at the Showgrounds by 5pm on Thursday, 26th October.

AGE OF ALPACA

Alpacas must be entered into their correct class for their age (i.e. age on the day of the show unless otherwise specified).

PROTESTS



ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH & SAFETY REGULATIONS

(To be read in association with General Safety Regulations)

ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

Site holders and Showmen must give protection of the environment a high priority in all activities on site and must not commit any act that will place the Bendigo Agricultural Show Society Inc in breach of any regulation. Any accidental spill or release of substances which may contaminate or harm the environment must be immediately contained and then reported to the Secretary or Ground Manager. Any requirement to discharge substances into the air, stormwater or sewers must be approved by the Secretary.

Where the work requires the disposal of any environmentally harmful substance, the Site holders and Showmen shall be responsible for the removal, transport and disposal in accordance with all statutory regulations and laws, so as not to place BASS in breach of any regulation.

Tasks which require particular care include:

- Refuelling of engines of vehicles, generators, etc.
- Disposal of wastewater, cooking fats, etc.

ELECTRICAL

- All electrical equipment and appliances (power tools, extension leads, etc) must conform to all relevant statutory authorities' requirements.
- Earth Leakage Protection / Residual Current Devices must be used in conjunction with all power tools and extension leads.
- Extension leads must be fixed overhead away from pedestrian or vehicular traffic.
- Extension leads MUST BE safety tested and tagged with the tag current for the period of the Show.
- Any leads that require tagging on the day of the Show will be carried out at the expense of the Exhibitor. An Electrician John McClean will be on site for the duration of the Show or can be contacted on 0419 189 463.
- All electrical works and appliances shall comply with relevant Australian Standards.

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

Site holders and Showmen are to provide their employees with and enforce the wearing of, all safety equipment appropriate to the tasks being performed or as deemed mandatory to the Bendigo Agricultural Show Society Inc. This includes gloves, earmuffs, safety boots, safety glasses, facemasks, safety helmets, fall protection harnesses, etc in association with appropriate clothing.

Loose clothing, jewellery and unruly hair are dangerous near revolving machinery and personnel operating this equipment are to be suitably clothed.

CONDUCT OF SITEHOLDERS' AND SHOWMEN'S EMPLOYEES

Site holders and Showmen are responsible for the conduct of their employees. Skylarking, throwing of objects, careless driving, abusive language, fighting on the site and/or grounds is prohibited.

INSURANCES

It is mandatory for Showmen to have in place the following insurances:

- Workers Compensation Insurance in accordance with the applicable legislative requirements.
- Public and Product Liability Insurance with a limit of not less than \$5,000,000 for any one occurrence.
- Insurances for Plant and Equipment for which they are responsible.

SECURITY

Site holders and Showmen are responsible for securing their tools, equipment and property adequately, as well as the personal property of their employees, as the Bendigo Agricultural Show Society accepts no responsibility for damage or theft.

HOUSEKEEPING/CLEANING - Site holders and Showmen must continually keep their areas clean of debris, packaging materials, etc and place all waste in the provided bins.

Every effort is to be made to Reduce, Reuse and Recycle materials.

LPG CYLINDERS

All LPG cylinders are to be secure, safely installed, tested and ventilated.

PREVENTION OF FALLS

In March 2010 Worksafe Victoria introduced the OH&S [Prevention of Falls] Regulations 2010.

All guild members need to familiarise themselves with the regulations and the "Code of Practice- Prevention of Falls in General Construction". Both of which are available from Worksafe Victoria. It is the responsibility of members of the Showmen's Guild to ensure that they have appropriate and adequate prevention measures in place BEFORE any erection of equipment commences at the Bendigo Agricultural Show site. Erection of scaffolding is subject to separate statutory requirements and these are to be adhered to at all times, particularly the fitting of access ladders, kickboards and handrails.

Working at heights: There are regulations for working at heights 2 metres & above. Exhibitors must ensure they comply with Worksafe regulations when working above 2 metres. Guidelines for the use of ladders are set out in the OH&S [Prevention of Falls Regulations 2004 and the companion Code of Practice]. Additionally, all ladders shall conform to the appropriate Australian Standards, be maintained in safe condition and be tied off when in use. Aluminium ladders shall not be used for electrical work

MATERIALS BROUGHT ONTO SHOWGROUNDS

If there is risk or harm to either personnel or the environment, the Site holders and Showmen shall provide to the Secretary the Material Safety Data Sheet for the substance for approval, prior to use.

Flammable and combustible materials shall only be stored in approved containers, labelled with contents as per relevant regulations.

PAINTING / FIXINGS

Permission must be obtained before commencing any painting on any surface, which is the property of the Bendigo Agricultural Show Society Inc. Similarly, Site holders and Showmen should restrain from driving any nails or screws into any surface, which is the property of the Bendigo Agricultural Show Society for safety reasons (to avoid contacting electrical cables, water pipes, etc).

HIGH RISK ACTIVITIES

A number of Site holders' and Showmen's activities have been assessed as of higher risk and require additional attention to safety and environmental aspects:

- Amusement Rides All safety regulations and requirements of relevant authorities are to be complied with in the erection, securing, operation and dismantling of this equipment.
- Equipment Guarding All machine guards are to be maintained in a safe condition and be securely fitted to equipment before any equipment is operated. The equipment must be stopped before any guard is to be removed and an authorised person following safe procedures must only remove it.
- Additionally, prevention of falls as determined in section 10 must be implemented for the construction/ erection of this type of equipment.

EMERGENCY EXITS & FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT ACCESS

Access aisle ways and pathways to all Emergency Exits and Fire fighting equipment are to be kept totally clear at all times. External exits of doors from buildings are to be regularly checked for clear space. At all times there must be access along all roadways for fire fighting vehicles and other emergency services vehicles. [It is not permissible for ticket-boxes etc to protrude onto roadways etc and to block the safe access of these vehicles. Objects that protrude at height such as prize displays must also not protrude in the air space above roadways]

CITY OF GREATER BENDIGO HEALTH REGULATIONS

All food vendors (exposed and packaged) must adhere to City of Greater Bendigo Health Regulations, Registrations and Bylaws.
